# Nomination for Ramanujan Fellow

Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), a premier research institution under the aegis of the Department of Science and Technology, GoI and a Deemed-tobe-University invites applications from Indian nationals seeking to be supported by JNCASR in nomination for a Ramanujan Fellowship. If awarded, the Centre will provide necessary administrative and basic R&D infrastructure support for the duration of fellowship; the rest of the terms will be as per the fellowship norms. Highly motivated candidates who complement the ongoing research programs of the Unit or bring novel expertise or research perspectives are invited to apply. The successful candidate is expected to develop and maintain an active independent research program, mentor master's and Ph.D. students jointly with a regular faculty as per norms and contribute to teaching and outreach activities of the Unit.

## Eligibility

Ph.D. in relevant areas with at least two years of post-doctoral experience, high-quality publications, and strong academic credentials.

## Short listing Criteria

A panel of experts will initially screen candidates, followed by a seminar and interactions with Unit faculty members for those short-listed. The final candidate on the shortlist will receive a host institution endorsement/sponsorship certificate to be considered for a Ramanujan fellowship.

- 5. Name and contact information of at least three referees.
