TWAS – Elsevier Foundation Project Grants to teams of women for concrete action-based projects under the umbrella of the “climate action” SDG

Applications will be accepted from 21 February 2022 to 19 May 2022

The World Academy of Sciences (TWAS) – for the advancement of science in developing countries, is a UNESCO programme unit aiming to build capacity in science and technology in the Global South (www.twas.org).

The Elsevier Foundation is part of Elsevier’s corporate responsibility programme, and contributes over \$1 million a year to non-profit organizations, making unique contributions to sustainable development in gender, health, climate and reducing inequalities (<https://elsevierfoundation.org/>).

The current call is for project grants, available to teams of women made up of scientists and technical experts.

Under this scheme, grants are awarded to teams of 2-5 women for action-based projects which, although scientific in nature, will take them outside the lab to promote practical and tangible change under the umbrella of the “climate action” SDG in their local context. The **principal applicant** and project leader is a **woman scientist, holding a PhD, living and working in a science and technology lagging country**. **Co-applicants are either scientists or technical experts in a field relevant to the project, from any developing country**.

There is no age limitation for this programme.
